St. Michael the Archangel



A CUP OF JOE

Greetings in Christ, all!

We are entering one of my favorite weeks, the week that includes June 13th, my anniversary of ordination and, more importantly, the Feast of St. Anthony of Padua.

St. Anthony of Padua is the Patron Saint of preachers and of lost articles. I enjoy preaching and I've lost my mind so this guy is perfect for me...We are in-



credibly blessed to have his First Class relic in our church.

On his feast, I will be praying the normal 8 am Mass and will be happy to bless everyone there with his relic afterward. St. Anthony is a powerful, powerful intercessor and one of my favorite saints. Please, don't hesitate to go to our reliquary in the front of the church and seek the intercession of these wonderful saints.

In 1998 I was ordained on the feast of St. Anthony and I thank God every day that He lets me serve in this way. Please know that I recognize I am completely, totally dependent on your prayers for me and I thank you with all my heart for your love and prayers.

I had a really cool thing happen in our confessional line that I have permission to share with you.

I had a mom come in with some little squeakers and I started off as I always do when a mom or dad comes into the confessional with little ones: I invited her not to worry if they fuss or make noise during the confession. She then told me that when she got into church, the line was really long, but the people in line insisted she move to the front because her hands were so full with her little ones. She was moved by the experience and I am moved to share it with you. Thank you so much for your generous hearts; this is what every confession line should be like and I honor you all for it.

I do want to remind you of a couple of things about confession:

First, I do not do face-to-face confessions. I find the spiritual benefits of anonymous confessions to be so vast that I don't offer face-to-face in my confessional. If you require face-to-face confession, I suggest you let the usher know that so they can direct you to one of the non-anonymous confessions.

Second, please keep in mind that on the first Saturday of the month, we have three or four priests hearing confessions. If you choose to go once a month, that is the best time to go. The line might look really long, but it moves quickly because we have so much help. Third, please, please go to the next priest in line. Putting it bluntly, confession is confession. The priest doesn't matter, assuming he is not cruel or a priest not teaching authentic Catholic theology. We strive to ensure that the priests who help us are good priests, so please go to the next guy in line.


Finally, we have ushers to help us with confessions. If they direct you on the rules, please do not be rude or angry with them. They are volunteers and they are doing what I ask.

Thanks so much for your radical dedication to the Sacrament of Confession. I am so terribly blessed to be a priest at a parish where so many take advantage of this wonderful sacrament.

On this, the beginning of my 27th year as a priest, I lack the ability to articulate how grateful to God I am for all of you for letting me be your priest. I believe I am blessed beyond all other men.

STEWARDSHIP

I have coached all three of my children in soccer at some time in their lives. I loved teaching them and their teammates the importance of functioning as one unit. If we were not all moving together toward victory, we would all find ourselves together in defeat. We used to go through one drill I called the "human foosball." We would scrimmage with players in lines like on a foosball table. If you ever got too far behind or too far ahead of those in your line, play would stop and the ball would go to the other team. The goal was to help build an awareness of where your teammates were on the pitch and to teach the lesson that no one player is a team onto themselves.

As disciples and stewards, we sometimes find ourselves far behind or maybe even too far ahead. As a consequence, our actions either hinder the ability of the Body of Christ to evangelize and pass on the faith to a new generation or present the Church as an entity that sees itself as judgmental or too holy to be in the world. We are called to community, and in that community, we must be aware of our brothers and sisters in the faith. At times, we need to help them grow in their faith. Other times, we need to slow down and realize that we cannot change the world on our own. We all have unique gifts we are called to share, and we can only bear true witness to the power of the Body of Christ when we are all moving together and making each other strong.

- Relics at Holy Family -

Feast Day | June 15



Anthony was born Fernando Bulhom in Lisbon, Portugal in the year 1195. He entered the religious order of St. Augustine at the age of 15 and after many years of extremely intensive study, he was ordained a priest. As a young priest, he witnessed the bodies of 5 Franciscan martyrs being returned home after being tortured and beheaded by Muslims for preaching the Gospel. He was inspired by their courage and dedication and became a Franciscan after, at which point, he changed his name to Anthony. His incredible love for God, his great preaching and his deep personal holiness took him all over Italy and France, entering towns and Churches where people had abandoned the faith and bringing them back. He suffered greatly in many ways, but was known to be joyful, brave, selfless and totally dependent on God. St. Francis loved St. Anthony's simple love for God and asked him to teach young Franciscans, something he did with great devotion. His preaching and kindness were so renowned that crowds in excess of 30,000 showed up at various times, forcing events out of the Church and into fields, where he preached and heard confessions all day. He died, probably from exhaustion at the age of 36. After receiving last rites, his brothers noticed him staring at something and asked him what he was looking at. He laughed and cried out "I see my Lord!" and breathed his last. People gathered at his tomb and prayed so often and with such great results, that it was inevitable he would be named a Saint. He is the Patron Saint of Preachers and of lost articles. He is usually pictured holding the child Jesus, a lily or a book.

St. Anthony, thank you for your yes to God everyday.

Pray for me now to be brave, kind and thoughtful.

Help me to love you simply and to simply love you.

Pray that my words bring life to people and that I learn to see their needs and meet them as I can.

I pray that, like you, I don't get overly burdened by hardships, but trust that you can and will bring good out of anything I encounter.

Help me to forgive those who hurt me and pray for me to forgive myself for

Help me to forgive those who hurt me and pray for me to forgive myself for anything I've done to hurt others.

May I carry Jesus with me wherever I go. Amen.

In the Family Way

Look here: there is no one more family-oriented than me. I drive a minivan. I wear mom jeans. I wipe unidentified gunk off of kids' faces without a second thought.

I'm all about family, but I'm not always a fan of what "family" has come to mean in the modern lexicon. Family values. Family-friendly. Family-oriented. It's usually a synonym for "non-offensive." Soft. Moderate. Nice.

It's all fine, I suppose. But is it genuine? Creating a family, bringing that family physically into the world, was the hardest and most painful thing I ever did. The care and keeping of that family — the teamwork with my spouse, the feeding and watering of the children, the teaching of the writing and the reading the and praying — it's very hardcore. It's not all stuffed animals and peekaboo. It's a mental, spiritual, and physical challenge that daily brings me to my knees.

I'm not even talking exclusively about parenting young children. I'm talking about being part of a family in any way — being a son, being a daughter, being a sister and cousin and uncle. Families are complicated and strange and messy. Sometimes boundaries need to be drawn, or they need to be crossed. Sometimes walls need to be put up or torn down. It's never easy. It's never simple.

But I've never known someone who didn't want to be part of a family in some way, whether that's a blood family or one created by circumstance. And there's a reason Christ creates a family ("Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother") and not a club.


A family is a crucible, yes — but what comes out is so much more beautiful than what went in. For all the effort and even pain that is sometimes involved in a family relationship, there is nothing more defining, more fulfilling.

We are part of Christ's family, and what we can expect from that is certainly not a life of simple, clear-cut, undemanding discipleship. We can expect confusion. We can expect discomfort. But we can expect to be perpetually drawn to the heart of one who loves us without hesitation, without condition.

In the end, we're family.







Our Catholic Heritage

142nd Pope - Sergius IV

Born in Rome, he was elected pope on July 31, 1009. He maintained friendly relations with the Emperors of the East and of the West. He tried in vain to reduce the immorality among clergy by elevating the behavior among the Bishops and the powerful Abbots. When the Sainted Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem (which is built on the grounds



where religious historians believe Jesus was crucified, buried and resurrected) was sacked by the Egyptian Caliph Fatimid Caliphate, Sergius IV began promoting the crusades. He wrote a Papal Bull, (an official letter) ordering the Muslin population be driven from the Holy Land, but the call to arms was in vain. Pope Sergius IV died May 12, 1012, and was buried in the Basilica of St. John Lateran.


