Our Catholic Heritage

by Earl Hagen 199th Pope - Innocent VI (1352-62)

Born either 1282 A.D. or 1295 A. D. in Beyssac, France. Birth name, Étienne Aubert. Aubert taught civil law in Toulouse, France. Appointed Bishop of Noyon in 1338. then Bishop of Clermont in 1340, then on September



20th, 1342, as cardinal priest, and cardinal bishop for Ostia and Velletri in February of 1352.

He was appointed pope December 18, 1352 A.D., taking the name Innocent VI, ruling in France instead of Rome where the traditional, long-standing Papal seat of power was. Ruling in exile allowed the kings of France to more easily influence church and state matters. Example exists in the signing of the Treaty of Brétigny between France and England. As pope, one of his first acts in office was to revoke an agreement that had been signed previously declaring popes as inferior to the College of Cardinals.

He struggled with finances for the majority of his papacy. Wealth was amassed by earlier popes, forcing him to take drastic and humiliating measures to save money. Chapel staff was reduced from 12 to 8. Embarrassingly, he was forced to sell off art works instead of being able to pay to commission them. He often complained he was broke. Ongoing wars in Italy sapped needed resources. He also oversaw the recovery of the city of Avignon as it struggled with the Black Plague. Between the two trials, Innocent found himself impoverished by 1357 A.D.

Pope Innocent VI died on September 12, 1362 A.D. of old age in relative peace in Avignon, somewhere between 67 and 80 years of age.

My dream is to unleash a massive tidal wave of Holy Moments by raising up an amazing grassroots movement to transform our culture one Holy Moment at a time.

Your mission is to create Holy Moments in your own life and teach three other people about Holy Moments. Everything you need to do that is in this book.

It may seem like too little to have any real impact, it may seem like it would take forever at that rate, but not once you understand God's math lesson. Let's take a look at the divine strategy known as Spiritual Multiplication.

You are just one person: (1).

You teach three other people about Holy Moments: 1 + (1 x 3 = 3) = 4.

And those 3 new people teach 3 other people: 4 + (3 x 3 = 9) = 13.

And those 9 new people each teach three more 13 + (9 x)3 = 27) = 40.

Saint

July 18: St. Camillus de Lellis (1550-1614)

At 17 he was afflicted with a disease of his leg that remained with him for life. In Rome, he entered the San Giacomo Hospital for Incurables as both patient and servant, but was dismissed for quarrelsomeness after nine months. He served in the Venetian army for three years. Then in the winter of 1574, when he was 24, he gambled away everything he had-savings, weapons, literally down to his shirt. He accepted work at the Capuchin friary at Manfredonia, and was one day so moved by a sermon of the superior that he began a conversion that changed his whole life. He devoted the rest of his life to the care of the sick, and has been named, along with



St. John of God, patron of hospitals, nurses and the sick. With the advice of his friend St. Philip Neri, he studied for the priesthood and was ordained at the age of 34.

The Frederick Douglass Project for

Justice (Michigan Site - Genesee County Jail) The Douglass Project offers a multi-state Prison Visitation Program that enables community members around the country to visit local correctional facilities and engage in open, face-to-face conversations with incarcerated people. We believe that these unique encounters will spur understanding and empathy – for both visitors and incarcerated individuals – that will, in turn, drive meaningful personal and systemic change.

Cohorts of approximately 10-20 outsiders per visit will visit correctional facilities and engage in face-to-face conversations with a same-sized group of incarcerated adults. The conversations are facilitated by Douglass Project staff using proven tools and techniques that encourage respectful sharing and honest and dignified discussion. Cohorts of outside participants can join individually or as an affiliated group.

General visit details:

- 3-hour program
- Prison tour (depending on the facility)
- Large group introductions
- Small group conversations
- Large group reflections

Please note that the Douglass Project does not provide transportation or funding to/from any in-person visit site.

Before the visit, outside participants are required to watch a 30-minute orientation video (in advance of the visit) and complete paperwork for a security clearance; paperwork requirements differ by facility.
