

Greetings in Christ!
I wanted to let you know that I'll be taking a bit of a vacation/retreat this month. You may remember that every year, I take a 10-12 day retreat vacation around this time and that time is creeping up on me! I'll be leaving right after my last mass this Sunday, July 24 and returning late the next week. I'll be

staying at my cousin's house up north and I'm excited to sleep and not make decisions for a while... hahaha.

One of the things that I keep meaning to mention to you is the priest situation in our diocese.

To be clear, the Lansing Diocese is doing better than most in the US, but the issue is that there are less and less of us priests everyday, while the need for priests is relatively unchanged. Although Catholics go to or support their church less and less, they do still place tremendous demands on the Church and their priests and rightly so. We are, as priests, to be faithful to our call and make sure that fidelity is not contingent on whether they come to or support the Church in any way. That means we're serving you who come to Mass and support your church as well as praying funerals, baptisms, weddings, last rights, hospital and home visits for those who don't. I'm bringing this up because it's getting harder and harder to find priests to help us plug in the gaps when Fr. Le or I are gone and I'm asking for your prayers and patience as we deal with the limitations of myself and Fr. Le. There may be weekdays we can't get to confession sessions or maybe even Mass...I hope to avoid this of course but it has proven inevitable at times.

I have been blessed beyond what I can describe here by the way you love us both, support us and give us your prayers and patience. I hope you know I'm not writing this because any one has failed, not at all. I'm just putting this up as a reminder and hopefully, a reason to get all of us to pray that God sends us more priests!

I love you all and thank Jesus I get to be your priest.





July 17, 2022 | 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time


"Our families need to ask for the gift of the Spirit! Through prayer, even in the busiest times, we give time back to God, we find the peace that comes from appreciating the important things, and we encounter the joy of God's unexpected gifts. Through daily prayer may our homes become, like the house of Martha and Mary, places where Jesus always finds a warm welcome (Pope Francis)." While it is necessary to attend to the details of hospitality, learning how to be present to people, experiences, and God is sometimes more important. Creating homes that are welcoming environments requires not only organization and structure but members who truly enjoy being there and celebrating life with one another.

Details can often get the best of us. While attending to details is important to success, our obsession with them can be problematic. Whether wanting to make a good impression, fear of failure, insecurity, or emotional immaturity, throwing ourselves into the "details" of hospitality can distract us from being present to those we want to serve. Conversely, focusing exclusively on being present without any attention to detail also sets our attempts at hospitality up for disaster! We need a balance of both. But creating a truly welcoming space in our homes and within ourselves requires still more.

We have to be empty of ourselves. Becoming a welcoming, hospitable person is not possible in someone focused on their own needs and desires. If the one we serve is the one who looks back at us in the mirror, then there is no space for anyone else. While Martha and Mary had different ideas of what it means to serve, they both had the inner space and freedom to do so. They were detached from themselves. Detachment becomes the challenge to hospitality and creating a God-centered, open-hearted space in our lives. When we impulsively act out of our personal agendas, violence, abuse, pride, greed, lust, power, control, passion, and self-aggrandizement encroach upon the space needed to be present to another human being. Not only can others not find a home in us, but even God cannot find a home in us!

- Answer phone




Donate Blood, Give Life

Our Catholic Heritage by Earl Hagen 43rd Pope - Celestine I

Born in Rome, he was elected pontiff on September 10, 422. Celestine's tenure was largely spent combating vari-



ous ideologies deemed heretical. Celestine I called the 3rd **Ecumenical Council which** condemned the followers of Nestorius, the Patriarch of Constantinople.

Deacon of the Campania region, he was a friend of St. Augustine which aided him in resolving differences with the Church in Africa. He followed the ecclesiastical policies of

Pope Boniface I and fought against the Pelagians especially in Great Briton and southern France.


Celestine I died July 27, 432 and was buried in Rome at the Church of Santa Prassede.

Excerpts from the Lectionary for Mass @2001, 1998, 1970 CCD.

July 19: St. Mary Mackillop (1842-1902)

Born in Melbourne in 1842 to parents who had emigrated from Scotland, Mary grew up in a family that faced constant financial struggles. As a young woman she was drawn to religious life but could not find an existing order of Sisters that met her needs. In 1860 she met Father Julian Woods. who became her spiritual director. Together they founded a new community of women—the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Sacred Heart, also known as the Josephite Sisters. Its members were to staff schools especially for poor children, as well as orphanages, and do other works of charity. "Have courage no matter what your crosses are."--Mother Mary of the Cross
