# Our Catholic Heritage

by Earl Hagen 93rd Pope – Paul I Born in Rome, he was the brother of Pope Stephen II. He was elected pope on May 29, 757, when his brother became too sick to rule and died. He continued to build friendship with King Pepin of France

and encouraged a deeper union with the Greek Church. These friendships were necessary to regaining lands taken by the Lombards in previous wars and development of the emerging Papal States. In other achievements, he visited prisons and freed those prisoners condemned for debts. He discovered the remains of St. Petronilla, who, according to tradition, was the daughter of St. Peter. Paul I died June 28, 767, and is buried in the Vatican Grottoes.

### God Is Love

I was recently at a Catholic conference and had a conversation with someone living in the thick of Hollywood culture. He was Catholic and spoke of how hard it was to live out his faith amid tremendous temptation and negativity toward religion. He spoke about how going to daily Mass helped to keep him centered and stay strong in his faith. He was a great witness to living out one's faith in the face of disbelief.

One thing that he told me stood out above all the rest. He spoke of his engagement to his fiancé and how important it was to him that God was a major part of their relationship and their lives as individuals as well. He told me he said something to her like, "If you don't love Jesus more than you love me, this is never going to work." What an amazing and truly moving witness!

Songs and books are written about the intense longing one human being can have for another. We can describe another as meaning everything to us. We speak of wanting to offer our complete selves to our beloved. However, true love is about more than wanting to be with that person. It is about wanting that person to know a love even greater than theirs: the love of God. No love can last without God. My Hollywood friend knew this to be the case. He showed his true love for his wife-to-be by sharing more than himself — he shared the very One who created love.

#### Saint

#### July 3: St. Thomas


St. Thomas was one of the Twelve Apostles. He is remembered for his incredulity concerning Christ's resurrection from the dead. When the other apostles told Thomas that they had seen the Risen Lord, he replied, "I will never believe it without probing the nail-prints in his hands, without putting my finger in the nail-marks and my hand into his side." When Jesus later appeared to him and told him to put his finger in the wounds of his hands and side, Thomas exclaimed, "My Lord and my God!" Thomas later preached the Gospel to the people of India. Since the fourth century, the celebration of the transference of his body to Edessa has been commemorated on July 3.

#### Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

As a boy my favorite board game was "Chutes and Ladders." The players roll dice to move from the start to the finish, from the bottom of the board to the top. If you land on a chute, you slide back and down. It was a bummer. Land on a ladder, and you jump well up the board and near the goal. It was a thrill to find a ladder and draw closer to the goal. That's life, isn't it? At every moment, we're either moving closer or farther from the goal of our lives.

How do we win? Jesus tells us the secret of life's chutes and ladders hinges on getting our loves rightly ordered. What we love in life is meant to be a ladder, drawing us up into God's love — including our family, friends, work, play, food, and drink. Even to give your water to someone out of love for Christ leads to a sure reward.

But those ladders of our loves can become chutes. If we love even our family members more than Christ, we slide down and back. If we love the persons and things in our life for the sake of Christ, He says we **"surely will not lose our reward."** The key difference between a chute and ladder, between our spiritual regression and advancement, is



our willingness to renounce everything — even our own life — for the love of Jesus. To allow everything and everyone we love to draw us to love him more — that's the difference between chutes and ladders.


