


St. Michael the Archangel

Mission Appeal Next Weekend - Latin Archdiocese of Trivandrum, India

Next weekend, at all Masses, Rev. Raju Pilla will be speaking about the works and the needs of the Latin Archdiocese of Trivandrum in India. Trivandrum has about 270,000 Catholics. Ninety percent of the people belong to fishing communities, the majority of whom depend on fishing for their livelihood. Ten percent are farm workers who are re-



cent converts from low caste Hindus. Unemployment and poverty are most rampant in the communities. The archdiocese depends on outside contributions to support its clergy, seminarians, catechists, and the humanitarian projects of the homes for the orphans, aged and destitute, which provide food, shelter, health care, and education. In 2021, Hurricane "Tauktae" left hundreds of families homeless. Monsoon sea-erosion each year, destroys several homes of the fishermen who live near the sea and make a living from fishing. The archdiocese is yet to recover from the crippling effects of financial devastation caused by the pandemic lockdowns. We humbly request your generous contribution. 

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

One of my close friends is a hermit priest who lives on a desert mountain. Recently I found myself in a group conversation about him. One vehemently objected, "What does he do up there all day? Nothing! Priests are down here working, running parishes, making a difference, and

he...he is doing nothing! What a waste." The words dripped with indignation and resentment. Most of the group quietly nodded in silent agreement. Were they correct?



No! To see why, consider a similar scenario in this

week's gospel. Jesus visits his friends Martha and Mary. A hardworking and exasperated Martha complains to Jesus that her sister is attending to him rather than to urgent household tasks. Our Lord, rather than praising hospitality, explicitly celebrates the less-productive sister for doing the "one necessary thing." He praises her for she "has chosen the better part" (Luke 10:42). Mary is busy doing what matters.

Before we freak out like Martha, consider that all work—domestic, manual, professional, ministerial, contemplative—is done to help us (sooner or later) to experience the love that makes us happy. We should be thankful for those who focus on the "better part" of radical, ceaseless prayer. They invite us to remember the purpose of all work is the enjoyment of love. Contemplatives, hermits, anyone fervently committed to prayer—they invite us to cast aside our forgetful, resentful, and self-aggrandizing attitudes in exchange for hearts ready to do what is finally necessary.

(Practicing) Catholic - Beneath the Surface

Mini reflection: Are you anxious about many things? Then you need to be right where Mary is: at the feet of Jesus, with all your burdens.

Martha's Burdens

It's time to admit it: I've been unfair to Mary in the past. Been a little catty about her. Oooh, Mary, she's so holy. Well, do you like to eat, Mary? Who made your lunch? Yeah, that's right: it was Martha. Because you know what? It's the Marthas who get things done in the world while the Marys lounge around reading Aquinas and attending silent retreats and going to Eucharistic Adoration whenever they want.

And there you have it, folks: my bitterness on full display! I tend to identify with Martha, not with Mary, and I need to stop doing that.

Because I am not Martha instead of Mary. I am both. We are all both.

Mary was a woman; she was expected to do the serving, too. She shared that burden; she wasn't abandoning it, heaping her portion on Martha. And it's so wrong to assume that Mary didn't have the same cares and anxieties as Martha — perhaps she even had more!

Here's the difference: Mary, unlike Martha (and me, I guess) knew where to go with them.

We typically see our burdens as an impediment to a relationship with Christ. *I'm so busy. I'm so overwhelmed.*There are so many demands on me, on my time, on my person, on my finances. Take a number, Jesus. Get in line. But we're thinking the wrong way. Burdens aren't an obstacle that stands between us and Christ. Burdens are the straightest path to his feet.

God knows about burdens, okay? Aside from being allwise and all-knowing, he basically completed a doctorate in suffering, taking on a human form (itself kind of a burden, if you think about it) and for 33 years lived among the hardest and heaviest burdens this world has to offer.

Why did he do this? Well, part of the reason was so that we could finally understand that our burdens aren't a barrier between us and God. On the contrary, they connect us to him.

Are you anxious about many things? Then you need to be right where Mary is: at the feet of Jesus, with all your burdens.

FOLLOWING OUR FAITH

Our Catholic Heritage

200th Pope - Blessed Urban V (1362-70)

Born in Languedoc, France, in 1310. Birth name Guillaume de Grimoard, a son of a revered knight. In 1327, he became a Benedictine monk not far from his home. Several years later, a priest in his own church. Later, he studied Canon Law across France and by 1342, completed his doctorate and began to teach. In 1352 he was appointed



as Abbot of Saint-Victor in Marseille. Shortly after he was sent off by the pope on several missions, gaining praise from cardinals and other members of the Church. While in Naples on a mission, Pope Innocent VI died. Cardinals chose Guillaume de Grimoard, an outsider that could reform the Church. His diplomatic experience and education gained him the position of Pope Blessed Urban V on September 28, 1362.

He focused on bringing peace to Europe and doing good for the community. He chose a simple lifestyle and expected established figures in the Catholic Church to follow as well. This meant a big adjustment. He founded several schools, supported students, and was very generous with the poor. He rejected personal gain from his position, even opposing church office sales and giving rewards to his family. He was against forced conversion or baptism, making the penalty for attempts excommunication.

He, as other popes, tried to bring the Papacy back to Italy, but failed. September 24th, 1370, Pope Urban V fell ill. The exact cause of his illness is unknown. His health deteriorated slowly. Before he passed, he requested that the palace be moved to his brother's house so that he could be close to his loved ones and in a more humble setting. His Feast Day is on the same day as his death, December 19. He served as pope for a little over eight years. He died December 19, 1370, at the age of 60.

Saint July 21: St. Lawrence of Brindisi (1559-1619)

He entered the Capuchin Friars, taught theology to his fellow religious, and was chosen to fill positions of leadership in his order. St. Lawrence was declared a Doctor of the Church because he was a great scholar and preacher, gifted in languages, and was a humble and holy administrator with great wisdom, but one of the greatest accomplishments attributed to this saint was the repulsion of the Turks during the Battle of Stuhlweissenburg.

The Frederick Douglass Project for Justice (Michigan Site - Genesee County Jail)

The Douglass Project offers a multi-state Prison Visitation Program that enables community members around the country to visit local correctional facilities and engage in open, face-to-face conversations with incarcerated people. We believe that these unique encounters will spur understanding and empathy - for both visitors and incarcerated individuals - that will, in turn, drive meaningful personal and systemic change.

Cohorts of approximately 10-20 outsiders per visit will visit correctional facilities and engage in face-to-face conversations with a same-sized group of incarcerated adults. The conversations are facilitated by Douglass Project staff using proven tools and techniques that encourage respectful sharing and honest and dignified discussion. Cohorts of outside participants can join individually or as an affiliated group.

Before the visit, outside participants are required to watch a 30-minute orientation video (in advance of the visit) and complete paperwork for a security clearance; paperwork requirements differ by facility.
