

WHAT'S HAPPENING HERE

Family Formation

We are excited to introduce Family Formation, an exciting new model for Religious Education at Church of the Holy Family.

This dynamic, family-centered approach is rooted in the Catechism of the Catholic Church and brings children and parents together to grow in faith through shared experiences, prayer, and learning.

For grades 1st through 5th, formation will meet twice monthly on scheduled Sunday afternoons from 1:00 -3:00 PM. Sessions will begin in the St. Joseph Center with joint activities for the whole family. Parents will then gather for catechesis while children meet in classrooms by grade level. Sessions conclude with prayer and fellowship as one faith community.

Students in 6th, 7th, and 8th grades will also meet during this time in a youth group-style format. Parents of these students are welcome to attend, but not required.

Sacramental Preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion are included in Family Formation and will be introduced in the 2nd-grade sessions. The Parent meeting for these Sacraments will be held on Wednesday, September 17, 2025, following the 6:00 pm Mass.

Confirmation Preparation is not included in Family Formation. Students seeking Confirmation are invited to attend the Confirmation Parent/Student meeting on September 10, 2025, following the 6:00 pm Mass. Students in Confirmation Preparation are not required to enroll or participate in Family Formation.

Enrollment is now open!

Cost: \$125 per family if registered by September 1, 2025 (late registration is \$150). Fees include materials, snacks, beverages, and sacramental prep.



Mission Appeal This Weekend -Latin Archdiocese of Trivandrum, India

This weekend, at all Masses, Rev. Raju Pilla will be speaking about the works and the needs of the Latin Archdiocese of Trivandrum in India. Trivandrum has about 270,000 Catholics. Ninety percent of the people belong to fishing communities, the majority of whom depend on fishing for their livelihood. Ten percent are farm workers who are re-



cent converts from low caste Hindus. Unemployment and poverty are most rampant in the communities. The archdiocese depends on outside contributions to support its clergy, seminarians, catechists, and the humanitarian projects of the homes for the orphans, aged and destitute, which provide food, shelter, health care, and education. In 2021, Hurricane "Tauktae" left hundreds of families homeless. Monsoon sea-erosion each year, destroys several homes of the fishermen who live near the sea and make a living from fishing. The archdiocese is yet to recover from the crippling effects of financial devastation caused by the pandemic lockdowns. We humbly request your generous contribution. 



Our Catholic Heritage

201st Pope - Gregory XI (1370-78)

Born in a castle in Maumont, France, circa 1329. Birth name Pierre. When he was 18, his uncle named him cardinal deacon. On December 30, 1370, nearly 20 cardinals quickly and unanimously picked him as the next pope. His papacy began on December 30, 1370, taking the name Gregory XI. He attempted two reconciliations. The first between England and



France failed, then Naples and Sicily to help resolve their issues. He made attempts to unify the Latin and Greek Churches, but was unsuccessful. Both areas remained under the control of the papacy, which allowed them to work together.

Pope Gregory XI made the mistake of appointing men in France to positions of power, causing Italians to turn to the Duke of Milan for help. The pope listened to their concerns and made several decisions, resulting in the excommunication of some men and a law that limited what people in that city could own.

Pope Gregory XI became only the second pope in history to leave France for Italy. He began his journey to Rome in September of 1376. When he arrived in Rome, he faced a massacre and riots.

He was disgusted by what he saw in the city, hoping to return to France, but his death prevented that from happening. Although the pope died of natural causes not long after his arrival, he brought the papacy back to Rome after 67 years. The pope died on March 27, 1378, around the age of 48 or 49. His papacy lasted for seven years and 87 days.

21,523,360 + (14,348,907 x 3 = 43,046,721 = 64,570,081. There are 195 countries in the world, this is more than the population of 57 of those countries combined. 64,570,081 + (43,046,721 x 3 = 129,140,163) =

193,710,244. 193,710,244 + (129,140,163 x 3= 387,420,489) = 581 million. That's almost twice the population

of the United States. And that's just 18 cycles. 581,130,733 + (387,420,489 x 3 = 1,162,261,467) = 1.75 billion.

1,743,392,200 + (1,162,261,467 x 3 = 3,486,784,401) = 5.2 billion.

 $5,230,176,601 + (3,486,784,401 \times 3 = 10,460,353,203) = 15.7$ billion.

There are less than 8 billion people on the planet today. It would take less than 21 cycles to reach the whole world's population. Just one more cycle and you would reach the entire population of the next 100 years. That's the power of Spiritual Multiplication.

Saint

August 1: St. Alphonsus Liguori (1696-1787)

At the University of Naples he received, at the age of 16, a doctorate in both canon and civil law by acclamation, but he soon gave up the practice of law for apostolic activity. He was ordained a priest and concentrated his pastoral efforts on popular (parish) missions, hearing confessions, forming Christian groups. He founded the Redemptorist congregation in 1732. It was an association of priests and brothers living a common life, dedicated to the imitation of Christ, and working mainly in popular missions for peasants in rural areas. Alphonsus is best known for his moral theology, but he also wrote well in the



field of spiritual and dogmatic theology. His Glories of Mary is one of the great works on that subject, and his book Visits to the Blessed Sacrament went through 40 editions in his lifetime, greatly influencing the practice of this devotion in the Church.

The Frederick Douglass Project for Justice (Michigan Site - Genesee County Jail)

The Douglass Project offers a multi-state Prison Visitation Program that enables community members around the country to visit local correctional facilities and engage in open, face-to-face conversations with incarcerated people. We believe that these unique encounters will spur understanding and empathy – for both visitors and incarcerated individuals – that will, in turn, drive meaningful personal and systemic change.

Cohorts of approximately 10-20 outsiders per visit will visit correctional facilities and engage in face-to-face conversations with a same-sized group of incarcerated adults. The conversations are facilitated by Douglass Project staff using proven tools and techniques that encourage respectful sharing and honest and dignified discussion. Cohorts of outside participants can join individually or as an affiliated group.

General visit details:

- 3-hour program
- Prison tour (depending on the facility)




