


Be assured of a continued remembrance in the prayers of the clergy, religious and the poor of the Diocese of Mandeville for you and your parish family. You have a wonderful parish.




Holy Family Lending Library




Our Catholic Heritage by Earl Hagen 45th Pope – Leo I

Originally from Volterra in Tuscia region, he was elected September 29, 440. He quickly demonstrated his capacity for governing by confronting Attila (known as "Scourge of God") and persuaded the Huns, a nomadic Germanic people ter-



rorizing northern Italy, not to attack Rome. He was not. however, able to evade the sacking of Rome in 455 by Genseric Vandals, resulting in the disintegration of the Roman Empire. He called the 4th and 5th Ecumenical Councils and defined the mystery of the Incarnation. He reinforced the supremacy of Rome's Bishop and held that papal power was granted by Christ to St. Peter, and that power was passed on by Peter to his successors. He is called "The Great" because of his energetic work in safeguarding orthodoxy, suppressing heresy, while maintaining unity of the Church. Leo I died September 10, 461. **July 31: St. Ignatius of Loyola (**1491-1556) St. Ignatius spent his early years at court and as a soldier. Later, he was converted to God and undertook theological studies at Paris where he attracted his first followers and afterwards at Rome he joined them together as the first mem-



bers of the Society of Jesus. His spirituality is expressed in the Jesuit motto, ad majorem Dei gloriam—"for the greater glory of God." In his concept, obedience was to be the prominent virtue, to assure the effectiveness and mobility of his men. All activity was to be guided by a true love of the Church and unconditional obedience to

the Holy Father, for which reason all professed members took a fourth vow to go wherever the pope should send them for the salvation of souls.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

What makes us feel secure? Many people look to tangible forms of security that will safeguard their livelihood and prepare for their future. We tend to associate security with things: the accumulation of goods and possessions, retirement funds, savings accounts, and substantial incomes. While acquiring these promises a life with less anxiety and worry, we actually find ourselves more preoccupied and consumed with their growth and preservation. We worry more! We can easily become quasi-hoarders, consumed with obtaining more tangible crutches. Our minds and hearts are always restless, and we never seem to be at peace.

Why do we so easily give our self-worth, value, and sense of security over to things? God certainly does not deny us the pursuit of a productive and enjoyable life but where do we draw the line? A sense of well-being and happiness can easily get deferred to sometime "in the future" while we continue to wrestle with the toils of today. There is no guarantee that there will be an earthly tomorrow and all of the frenzy we bring to securing our state in life will be for naught. When we are called from this world, will we even know where to begin to look for the tranquility and repose our souls so desperately need?

We cannot be hoarders, pursuers of vanity, or greedy. They just don't work as they are too dependent on things that can fall apart. Rather than always feeling the need for more, we need to learn how to be grateful for what we have. By learning to look inward we can learn how to live lives of faithful service to others. "Happiness can only be achieved by looking inward and learning to enjoy whatever life has, and this requires transforming greed into gratitude (St. John Chrysostom)." We all need to be good stewards of what has been entrusted to our care. Grateful hearts recognize the true source of what we have and realize that our true treasure lies not in what matters to us but to God.

Required for Those Entering

a Second Marriage

There is a new marriage preparation requirement for couples entering into a second union, whether following death of previous spouse or a previous nulled marriage.

Typical marriage education programs and ministries are not sufficient for couples entering into blended family marriages. Since marriage in a stepfamily is a "package deal," you must minister to both the couple and "the package." This requires addressing dynamics related to ex-spouses and co-parenting, loss, stepparenting, spiritual shame, finances, and the expectations of both children and adultsjust to name a few." To do anything less is grossly inadequate to prevent divorce.

The Smart Stepfamilies program, created by author, therapist, and blended family expert Ron L. Deal, brings together these different aspects a stepfamily will encounter, in order to empower blended family couples and their extended family for successful family living.

The Remarriage Retreat is a way for couples to come together in a non-threatening setting to learn about the challenges that will be experienced, as well as children entering into a stepfamily. It is also an opportunity for a couple to, possibly for the first time, begin to focus on previously unknown information or previously undiscussed topics that will bring challenges and begin the process of sharing with each other how this will be addressed within their new family dynamic.

All the Facilitators have journeyed through the trials and blessings of living in their own blended family and are willing to share their stories and help with the questions the attending couples may have.

Bishop's Priesthood Discernment Dinner


