(Practicing) Catholic - Beneath the Surface

Mini reflection: Too often, life falls short of my expectations — an opportunity didn't work out, a day didn't go the way I planned — so I ball up my fists and stomp my feet. And God takes the Book of the Gospels and opens it to Luke, Chapter 10.

On Pilgrimage

Before I embarked on my trip to the National Eucharistic Congress last summer with a group from my archdiocese, we had an orientation meeting. At that meeting, the coordinator of the trip shared with us "The Five Rules of Pilgrimage."

If you're not familiar with them (I wasn't), here they are:

- 1. Don't complain.
- 2. Don't complain. (It's so important, it's listed twice.)
- 3. When you see a bathroom, use it.
- 4. When someone offers you something, receive it.
- 5. When someone asks you for something, give it.

It's great advice for a pilgrimage, but more than that, I think it's great advice in general. So when I read today's Gospel and I hear Jesus say essentially the same thing to his disciples as they set out to evangelize (well, minus the bathroom tip, but those weren't as much of a thing in biblical Judea), I come to an important realization.

The whole Christian life is a pilgrimage.

Too often, life falls short of my expectations. An opportunity didn't work out. A day didn't go the way I planned (like, at all). A person didn't accept me. And I ball up my fists and stomp my feet like a full-grown Veruca Salt, and I yell: I cannot work in these conditions!

And then, I imagine God, on his celestial throne, sighs and opens the Book of the Gospels (surely he keeps it handy, don't you think?) to Luke, Chapter 10. And he whispers in my heart what he said to his disciples 2,000 years ago.

Don't complain. Be open and give of yourself, and in turn, receive what comes your way, whatever it is. If it's good, rejoice. If it's not good, move on. And in the end, remember where you're headed — the place you're trying to go.

Oh, and again: don't complain.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

In the days after the awful 2020 killing of George Floyd, a Catholic friend remarked, "Racism is today's great evil. We should put all our energy into fighting it." I admired her intuition that the church must stand firmly against evil. Amen, I thought. At the same time, something felt wrong. As months went by, I saw her steadily slide into bitterness and anger. Soon, despondency. She spoke of giving up the fight. Don't we too wonder how to fight evil without losing our joy or energy?

Jesus' words this week help. He says, "Rejoice not that you have power over demons, but that your names are written in heaven" (Luke 10:20). Notice the asymmetry in where he wants our focus: on the latter, not the former. Should we confidently embrace our God-given power to overcome evil? Absolutely. But even more so, we should emphasize the positive element of our relationship to God. It is tempting but dangerous to define ourselves by what we oppose. It is better to define ourselves by—to rejoice in —what we celebrate: in Jesus, God has written our names in heaven. This sustains our battles.

This week, our marching orders are: fight evil. But more deeply, rejoice that God knows and loves us personally, individually. We allow this joyful knowledge to undergird our fight against the darkness of our day. Then we enjoy long-term stability to be cheerful warriors, who never forget the



reason for the contests we are called to fight and win: love.






Cenacle of Divine Mercy of St. Mary Cathedral

Excerpts from God in the Diary of Saint Sister Maria Faustina (Diary, 742)



"Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must

also be acts of mercy, and I demand the worship of My mercy through the solemn celebration of the Feast and through the veneration of the image which is painted. By means of this image I shall grant many graces to souls. It is to be a reminder of the demands of My mercy, because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works."

FOLLOWING OUR FAITH

Our Catholic Heritage

by Earl Hagen 198th Pope Clement VI (1342-52)

Born circa 1291 in Maumont, France. Birth name Pierre Roger. His papacy began on May 7, 1342, choosing the name Clement VI. Around age 10, he began studying with Benedictine monks for several years. He attended the College of Sorbonne where he obtained his teaching license



and earned a doctoral degree. He served as a bishop and worked as a chancellor, forming lasting relationships with several popes. He became a cardinal before being chosen as pope. Prince John traveled to speak with the cardinals and push for the election of Pierre. The cardinals were already in the middle of making the decision when he arrived, but agreed with both his and the King's choice.

Clement VI practiced nepotism in the same way his predecessors did. He appointed 25 cardinals during his reign as pope. Most of them were from France, nearly half of them his relatives.

During the black plague, more than 30% of those in Europe died. Doctors advised him to keep the torches burning around his palace to avoid becoming ill. He ignored that advise and continued hearing confessions from the sick and dying. Clement VI became sick during the early 1350s. He suffered from kidney stones that occasionally kept him confined to bed and later developed a tumor. During his final days, he developed an abscess that became infected and left him even sicker. He would eventually succumb to those issues and pass away on December 6, 1352, of natural causes around age 60 or 61.

These are the two collaborations that will change the world: Collaborate with God to create Holy Moments, and collaborate with him again to teach other people how to create Holy Moments.


How many people? Three. That's all it takes. Three people. If every person who read this book committed to teach three other people to create Holy Moments, we would change the world.

July 11: St. Benedict (480-550) The father of Western monasticism and the Benedictine Order, Benedict left his studies in Rome to become a hermit. He settled in a rocky cave in Italy near Subiaco where he spent his days in prayer and fasting. After several years, other gathered around him. He organized them into communities. He eventually wrote his Rule, a flexible and moderate pattern of life that became the norm for monastic life in the West.


