

October 11: St. John XXIII

John XXIII, was pope for only a short time (1959 to 1963), but had an amazing impact on the church and the entire world. Largely remembered for convening the Second Vatican Council, Pope John XXIII (born Angelo Roncalli in 1881) wanted the church to be a strong voice proclaiming that love in modern times to modern people. He looked to the past, present, and future in making his decision to lead the church in that direction. He was canonized April 27, 2014.
