Our Catholic Heritage

150th Pope - Benedict IX Although Benedict IX installed himself as pope in October 1047, he was formally elected for the third time in November. A number of influential clergy and laity besought Emperor Henry III to cross the Alps and restore order. Henry intervened, and at the Council of Sutri in December



1046, Benedict IX and Sylvester III were declared deposed. Benedict gave up the pontificate as he was advised to do by Abbott St. Bartholomew. Repenting of the turbulent life led up to this point, he became a monk in the monastery of St. Basil in Grottaferrata. Here in 1048, he died and was buried in the abbey.

Saint

August 4: St. John Vianney (1786-1859)

After overcoming many difficulties (St. John Vianney was not a gifted student), he was ordained a priest in 1815. He was entrusted with a parish in the town of Ars in the diocese of Belley. Since he was renowned for his great skill in helping penitents, people came to him from many regions and devoutly accepted his counsels. Recommending liturgical prayer, John Vianney would say, "Private prayer is like straw scattered here and there: If you set it on fire, it makes a lot of little flames. But gather these straws into a bundle and light them, and you get a



mighty fire, rising like a column into the sky; public prayer is like that."

STEWARDSHIP

As human beings, we seem to have a wide array of insatiable desires. We long for more money, more time, and more stuff. We spend millions of dollars each year on remedies for our overeating. We look to our neighbors to see what they have that we want so we can keep up with them in the race toward happiness. We look for instant gratification only to find that our hunger for whatever it is remains intact.

Stewardship is the pathway to curbing all those cravings. On this journey, we let go of things that keep us tied down to this world and tied up in our sin. All that we have becomes instruments for God to use in our lives and the lives of our neighbors. When we have detached from enough in this world, we find out the truth: Nothing on earth can truly satisfy our cravings completely. Jesus Christ is the sole answer for our needs and desires. Although the truth is right in front of us at each and every Mass in the Eucharist, we can easily spend our days in denial of that truth. It takes trust to step out in faith and give it all over to God. We are all called to let go and let God be God. Answering the call is easier said than done. However, if we can finally make that bold move, we will find ourselves completed by the One who was with us all along.
