

#### **Our Catholic Heritage**

by Earl Hagen 103rd Pope – Leo IV

Born in Rome, he was elected pope on April 10, 847. He was the first pontiff to date official documents. He confirmed the Venetians in their right to elect the Doge




(Chief magistrate). He built walls around St. Peter's and Castel Sant' Angelo, but the Saracens burned Borgo (Vatican quarters), Leonine pilgrimage with the hostels, monasteries, national scholae, the old papal palace and small churches, next to the Castle. To neutralize the Saracens threat, the pope allied the sea cities of Naples, Amalfi and Gaeta to obtain a decisive naval victory over the Saracens. Pope Leo IV died July 17, 855, and is buried in the Colonna Chapel at St. Peter's Basilica.

#### Saint

#### September 15: Our Lady of Sorrows

The principal biblical references to Mary's sorrows are in Luke 2:35 and John 19:26-27. The Lucan passage is Simeon's prediction about a sword piercing Mary's soul; the passage in John's Gospel relates Jesus' words to Mary and to the beloved disciple. Many early Church writers interpret the sword as Mary's sorrows, especially as she saw Jesus die on



the cross. Thus, the two passages are brought together as prediction and fulfillment.


