
St. Michael the Archangel

Greetings in Christ, all!

In a couple of weeks, I am going to get up and talk at every Mass about an upcoming campaign for Catholic Schools for all parishes in our diocese. I'm very excited about this and I hope that you'll all help. I'll get into those details later, but I needed to tell you about its existence because



it has an impact on some other things I will be sharing with you:

In 2017 our parish entered into a Planned Unit Development (PUD) agreement with the City of Grand Blanc in which we agreed to address projects on our campus. The first three phases of the PUD are:

- 1. Build/Renovate our church COMPLETED
- 2. Build a new Outreach and Maintenance garage facility
- 3. Expand our parking lot to include a required number of parking spaces (this requires the demolition and removal of our current outreach building and maintenance garage and sheds).

The timeline demands of the PUD and the condition of our current Outreach house are such that we need to move forward with plans to build a new superstructure that will be a garage, storage area and a center for our Outreach work.

I want to let you know that you are going to start seeing some work being done on our property, however because of the upcoming campaign, our Bishop asked us not to fundraise for this project and, of course, we agreed. As it is now, we simply have to start the work before we've done the fundraiser and so that is where we are.

Now, what is our plan? We have been given a goal for fundraising to help Catholic Schools so we added to that total, knowing we have to fix the Outreach situation as soon as possible.

Whew! That was a lot and I hope it makes sense to you.

Please pray for our efforts here...I know Jesus is in

charge and He will give us all we need to do His work.

I'm so very grateful to be your priest.





Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

This morning I received a text message that a member of my extended family will likely die of cancer within the next few hours. His name is Luke. He is a 45-year-old husband and father of six. Though I am not as close to him as my sister (she is his sister-in-law and knows him well), I wonder: how can we, including Luke himself, manage such a terribly awful and unfair situation?



The words of this Sunday's Gospel offer a powerful and challenging path. Jesus says, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me" (Mark 8:34). Today I see with new freshness the starkness and strangeness of the words take up. The cross stands for suffering which is unjust, absurd, seemingly hopeless, and humiliating. Jesus doesn't say "accept" or "endure" or "tolerate," but "take up." Embrace it, actively. Choose it and lift it up for others to see what terrifies and sickens us. But somehow, for Jesus, this is the path to "saving one's life." A new world is breaking in, one in which love is everything, when no relationship can be wounded or die. I trust that in the embraced suffering of Luke and his loved ones, Jesus is taking up his cross and saving us all.

By the time you read this, barring a miracle, Luke will have died. He will be carrying his cross no longer. But we all still face suffering. This week let's not just endure, but take up our crosses, big and small. That's our only hope for saving our lives.

We will continue to have Easter and Christmas memorial collections as well. During Lent and Advent there will be no flowers in church.





September 21: St. Matthew Matthew, also known as Levi, was a tax collector in the town of Capernaum. Most tax collectors were hated by the Jews because they worked for the Romans, who had conquered the land. A tax collector could use his position honestly or dishonestly. The temptation to use the position to become rich was great. Matthew invited Jesus to a dinner where other tax collectors



(publicans) and sinners were gathered. The Pharisees were upset when they saw this, and they said to the disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" Jesus heard them and replied, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have come to call not the righteous, but sinners" (Matthew 9:9–13).

156th Pope - Alexander II


Born in Milan, he was elected with the support of Hildebrand of Soana on October 1, 1061. He dedicated himself mostly to religious activities rather than politics, attempting to maintain working relationship between clergy and lay peo-



ple. He renewed all decrees against clergy practicing simony and keeping concubines, especially in France. He was opposed by the German court, which nominated Peter Cadalus of Parmas as pope Honorius II, an anti pope. In 1062 the antipope was dropped by the German regents, and the schism ceased to be important. Alexander II died April 21, 1073.




