



Our Catholic Heritage

104th Pope - Benedict III

Born in Rome, he was elected on September 29, 855. He tried to unite the different factions in the struggle against the Saracens, but he was bitterly opposed by

the Emperor, who had his imperial troops attempt to place Anastasius (antipope) on the throne with the support of Bishop Arsenius. As a result, the Roman people resisted so fiercely that Benedict III regained his position as pope while the Antipope Anastasius held that (office) for only one month. Beloved by the people because of his virtue, generosity and sensitivity, he dedicated himself to so many works of charity for the needy. Pope Benedict III died April 17, 858.

Saint

September 17: St. Robert Bellarmine

His most famous work is his three-volume Disputations on the Controversies of the Christian Faith. Particularly noteworthy are the sections on the temporal power of the pope and the role of the laity. He incurred the anger of monarchists in England and France by showing the divine-right-

of-kings theory untenable. He developed the theory of the indirect power of the pope in temporal affairs; although he was defending the pope against the Scottish philosopher Barclay, he also incurred the ire of Pope Sixtus the Fifth.



Bellarmine was made a cardinal by Pope Clement VIII on the grounds that "he had not his equal for learning."
