


St. Michael the Archangel



The Stewardship for Saints and Scholars campaign aims to do this by making Catholic schools across the Diocese of Lansing ever more on-mission, affordable, and accessible while also ensuring an authentically Catholic education is available to all families who desire it for their children. This will require clear and consistent catechesis on two key principles of Catholic teaching:


The Role of Parents and the Church

The primary educators of a child are his or her parents. Catholic parents are obliged to provide for the Catholic education of their children. As our mother and teacher, the Church has a duty to help parents provide that Catholic education, primarily through the provision and maintenance of Catholic schools. This also involves supporting Catholic parents who choose to homeschool or enroll their children in religious education programs at their parish.

The Joy of Stewardship

Stewardship means recognizing that everything we have and everything we are is a gift from God and, thus, being grateful and generous in response to that divine beneficence. Our Catholic forebears sacrificed and, often, suffered much for their faithfulness to Jesus Christ and His Holy Church. They did so for the love of us. It is now our sacred duty and joy to give of our time, talent and treasure for our children, grandchildren and generations hence.










Saint

September 23: Padre Pio of Pietrelcina (1887-1968) In 1903 sixteen-year-old Francesco Forgione entered the Capuchin monastery at Morcone, Italy, where he received the name Brother Pio. After celebrating Mass on September 18, while sitting in the monastery choir before



an ancient crucifix, Padre Pio received the stigmata. He says he fell into a deep, peaceful repose, and an angel with blood oozing from his hands, feet, and side appeared to him. "I felt like I was dying," he said, "and I would have died if the Lord had not intervened to strengthen my heart, which was ready to burst out of my chest. When the mysterious creature left, I found that my hands, feet, and side had been pierced and were bleeding. . . ."

I learned about this from Sophia, another nurse from the hospital. "How long was Jane off from work?" I asked Sophia. "Three years!" she replied with a smile. "Anastasia is a saint," she continued. Talk about Holy Moments. I figure Anastasia triggered about ten million Holy Moments at lunch that day.

Holy Moments come in all shapes and sizes. Here are some more everyday examples: Control your temper, even if you are fully justified in losing it. Pray before making a decision. Encourage someone, coach someone, praise someone, affirm someone. Be patient with that person who drives you crazy. Do something that helps you become a-better-version-of-yourself, even when you don't feel like it. That's a Holy Moment.

157th Pope - Gregory VII

Born in Tuscany, he was elected April 22, 1073. A Council called by Gregory issued a Dictatus Papae: or known as **Investiture Controversy**. (1) the pope is universal; no one can judge him; (2) he alone can dispense from a



vow, (3) A new canon law governing the election of the pope by the College of Cardinals. Henry IV, who had been excommunicated in 1076, made his way to Canossa and, wearing only a rough habit, to receive a pardon. He was the first pope to introduce a policy of obligatory celibacy for the clergy. Gregory was hailed as one of the greatest of the Roman pontiffs after his reforms proved successful. Gregory VII died May 25, 1085.






