

## Our Catholic Heritage

by Earl Hagen 105th Pope - Nicholas I


Born in Rome, he was elected pope on April 24, 858. After grave disagreements with the Emperor Louis II, he united with him to form an army against the Saracens (Muslim Islamic tribes). He strenuously defended the liberty of the Church against Photios (ecumenical patriarch of Constantinople from 858 to 886). He rein-



forced the temporal power of the Church and the primacy of the Pope over all of the churches. This pope was also involved in a desperate struggle with the bishops of Lotharingia over the inviolability of marriage. Nicholas showed the same zeal in other efforts to maintain ecclesiastical discipline, especially as to the marriage laws. After years of antagonism with Fozio the Patriarch of Constantinople, he saw the rise of the schism with the Church of the East that would last centuries. Pope Nicholas I died November 13, 867.

### Saint

September 28: St. Wenceslaus Wenceslaus was born in Bohemia in 907. His father was killed in battle when Wenceslaus was young. This left the kingdom of Bohemia in the hands of his pagan mother, who



favored the anti-Christian factions. Ludmilla, Wenceslaus's grandmother, took over his education. Ludmilla was determined that Wenceslaus would do two things: be a Christian and rule his country. He worked with the Church, ended the persecution of the Christians, brought back exiled priests, and built churches. Wenceslaus set an example all could follow. He gave alms, was just to those who were rich and those who were poor, visited prisoners, and promoted the religious and educational improvement of his people.
