



A CUP OF JOE

Greetings in Christ! A blessed, restful and joy-filled Labor Day weekend to you all!

I have a bunch of information for you, so let's go one step at a time.

First of all, it is a recurring theme here that folks get emails or texts from people saying they are me. It usually presents as a situation where the person impersonating me sends an email or text asking



you to email back. Then, when you respond, the email indicates that I am in some situation where I can't talk, but need money. The scam continues with the person impersonating me asking you to send gift cards to give to sick people or orphans, etc. **To be clear, I will never, ever do this**. These are scams. If I ask for money, I do it from the podium at Mass or face to face. I'm so sorry that people are like this. Let's pray for their conversion.

Speaking of asking for money...please support us if you can. Many have switched over to online giving, which is incredibly helpful. At the same time, we struggle sometimes because we do not take up collections. Instead, we place a box at the entrance of the Church in the hopes that those not giving electronically will place donations in the box to help us do our ministry here. If you don't currently give, please know anything will help. At the same time, never feel like you have to donate to be a part of The Family.

Finally, I've received a few messages from people concerned about some of the young men who are studying to be priests. There is a lot of fake news out there right now about young men being persecuted and driven out of seminary because they are too conservative or too Catholic. Please don't worry about that. In my vast experience, this is not at all true.

When I was in seminary, there were a couple guys who were asked to leave because they were arrogant, rude and superior. They went on to star in a book about how good men were being driven out of seminary because of their virtue. This has been the case for as long as I remember: bad men convinced of their own virtue being asked to leave seminary and then playing the victim. To be clear, the system is not perfect: bad men get through sometimes. At the same time, I can't think of a Saint who suffered for righteousness and then went on a tour collecting money and attention because of it.

I hope this helps. Please don't worry. If God wants them to

be priests, they will be. Humans are not powerful enough to stop it.

Thank you with all my heart for loving The Church enough to ask, but please don't worry. These are, as a general rule, not ministries or causes we want to be associated with.

With all my love and prayers, I remain your most grateful priest.





Our Catholic Heritage

102nd Pope - Sergius II

Born in Rome, he was elected pope in January 844. He took the pontificate without asking for imperial confirmation. Emperor Lothair objected claiming pontifical elections had to be approved by the Emperor. During his pontificate the Saracens



(Islamic Muslims) laid siege to Rome in 846 and sacked the Basilica of Old St. Peter's and St. Paul's. Freed from the Saracen siege in 846 with the help of Naples and Amalfi, Muslims were defeated at Gaeta and Ostia in 849. During rebuilding, he reassembled the stairs of the praetorium, which became known as the "Holy Stairs." Pope Sergius died January 27, 847.

Saint

September 3: St. Gregory the Great (540?-604)

Gregory was the prefect of Rome before he was 30. After five years in office he resigned, founded six monasteries on his Sicilian estate and became a Benedictine monk in his own home at Rome. His book, Pastoral Care, on the duties and qualities of a



bishop, was read for centuries after his death. He described bishops mainly as physicians whose main duties were preaching and the enforcement of discipline. In his own down-to-earth preaching, Gregory was skilled at applying the daily gospel to the needs of his listeners. Called "the Great," Gregory has been given a place with Augustine (August 28), Ambrose (December 7) and Jerome (September 30) as one of the four key doctors of the Western Church.





The lending library (for religious books) is located in the gathering space. You are welcome to take a book and return it when finished for others to read. (We are not able to accept donations to the library at this time.)




