





Our Catholic Heritage by Earl Hagen

50th Pope – Anastasius II

Born in Rome, elected November 24, 496. Anastasius II was named pope largely with support from a faction that wanted to improve relations between



the West and the Eastern churches and end the Acacian schism. The church had been in a serious doctrinal dispute since 484. Anastasius II sent two bishops to Constantinople to meet with the Byzantine Emperor and work to end the schism. During his pontificate he brought about the conversion of Clovis, king of the Franks and his people. Died November 19, 498, and is buried in St. Peter's Basilica. 

Pancakes and Spaghetti are Back!

After a brief hiatus (June, July, August), Pancake Breakfasts and Spaghetti Dinners are back! Despite record inflation, our prices are unchanged. This month all proceeds from pancakes and spaghetti will be donated to five seminarians that the Knights support. Between Pancake Breakfast and Spaghetti Dinner this month, we have a goal to raise \$2,500 for our seminarians.

Baby Bottles for Life begins October 1

Our Baby Bottles for Life fundraiser begins next month, Saturday, October 1 Last year parishioners generously donated over ten thousand dollars! Some of the money was donated toward the purchase of an ultrasound machine. The rest was donated to local pro-life pregnancy centers.

Here is how it works. On October 1 and 2, after all Masses, the Knights hand out baby bottles. You can also grab a bottle from the Knights baby bottle collection box in the gathering area. Fill the bottle with loose change, bills, or even a check. Return the bottle to the Knights baby bottle collection box located in the gathering area in the church. The campaign runs from October 1 until December 31.

August Update - We were able to help 16 families in August

Thank you to all the parishioners, donors, and those who help with pickups and deliveries.

Yearly Progress - In the last year we have delivered:

- Over 1,900 household items (dishes, furniture, beds, appliances, etc.) to over 200 families
- Over \$5,000 in food collected by St. Mark, Goodrich
- Multiple cases of food and travel-size personals for the homeless
- Multiple bags of clothes have been taken to Holy Family Outreach, Seeds of Love, St. Luke's New Life Center, Crossover Outreach and other local outreaches
- Multiple truckloads of bedding, cribs, housewares, and building items to Habitat for Humanity, Catholic Charities, St. Luke's New Life Center, St. Vincent DePaul, etc.
- \$2,950 in support to Holy Family Outreach, \$500 in support to St. Luke's New Life Center, \$500 in support to Family Promise
- Over \$23,000 in baby/kid's clothes to Heartbeat for new babies and their siblings donated by Laurie's in\ Grand Blanc
- Over \$3,000 to Ukraine Refugee Relief
