





Everyday Examples of Holy Moments



Anastasia Petrov is a Russian immigrant and a nurse. "I love America," she says to me with her sixty-two-year-old smile. A few years ago, one of the other nurses at the hospital got cancer and had to take some time off work. Anastasia didn't know her very well, but she knew that the other nurse had three kids and that she needed to work. The hospital's policy allowed for the sick nurse to have six weeks off with pay, but after that her time away from work was without pay. At lunch one day Anastasia heard some of the other nurses talking about doing one of those online funding projects to help out. "We can do better than that!" Anastasia said to her colleagues. They all turned and stared at her in surprise.

Saint

September 11: St. Cyprian (d. 258)

Highly educated, a famous orator, he became a Christian as an adult. He distributed his goods to the poor and amazed his fellow citizens by making a vow of chastity before his baptism. Within two years he had been ordained a priest and was chosen, against his will, as Bishop of Carthage (near modern Tunis). Cyprian com-



plained that the peace the Church had enjoyed had weakened the spirit of many Christians and had opened the door to converts who did not have the true spirit of faith. When the Decian persecution began, many Christians easily abandoned the Church. It was their reinstatement that caused the great controversies of the third century and helped the Church progress in its understanding of the Sacrament of Penance. Cyprian lived in a time of persecution, and was sentenced to death by a local bureaucrat. Soon after, his name was soon placed in the Roman Canon, in Eucharistic Prayer I. The first North African martyr, St. Cyprian is also the patron saint of North Africa.



Our Catholic Heritage by Earl Hagen

by Earl Hagen **155th Pope - Nicholas II** Born in Bourgogne, he was elected on January 24, 1059. Pressure was exerted by Roman nobility to win back their lost authority in pontifical elections. Nicholas immediately called the Gregorian Reform, a synod council at Lateran to



(1) define certain provisions regarding discipline and faith, (2) he mandated a decree reforming the procedures used in pontifical elections, (3) forbade the investiture of bishops without papal authorization, (4) future election of the popes should be reserved to Cardinal-bishops and cardinal priests. Nicholas's reform was an important step toward establishing the independence of the church. Nicholas II died July 27, 1061. He was buried in the Basilica of Santa Maria di Collemaggio.


