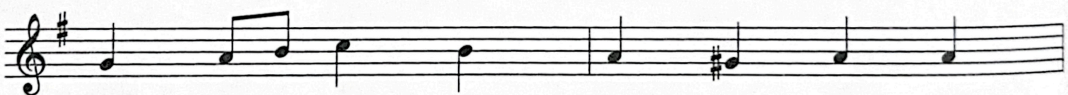

but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

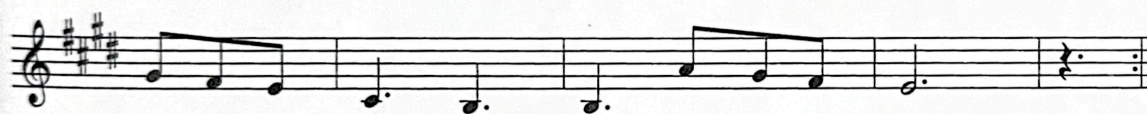
