from there He will come to judge the living and the dead.

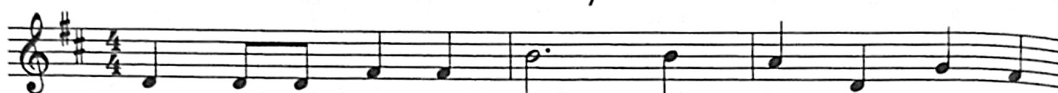

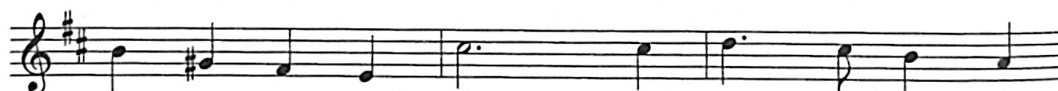

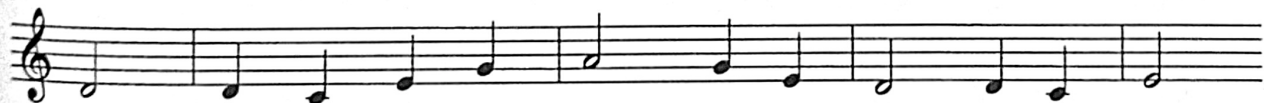
