## St. Michael the Archangel

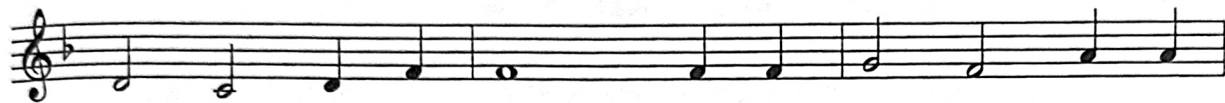

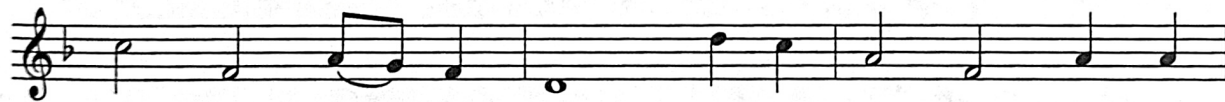

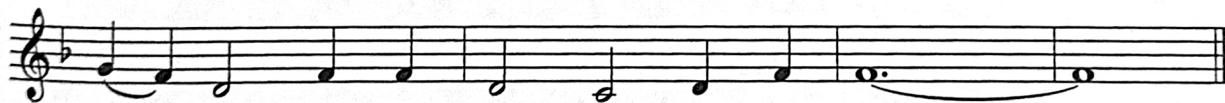

Thus says the LORD:

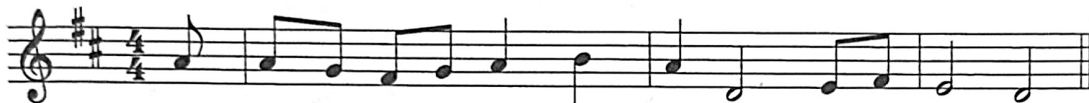
Share your bread with the hungry,

## GOSPEL

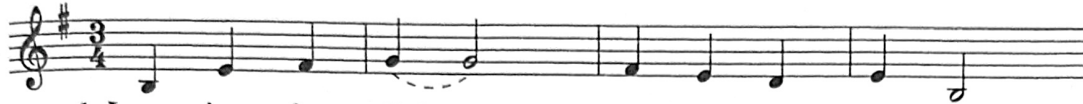
*Matthew 5:13-16*



Now you know that I will not be silent, I'll always sing your praise.

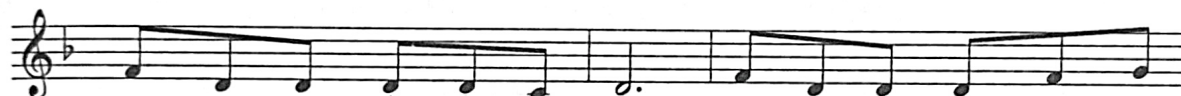
