May your kindness, O God, be upon us who place our hope in you.



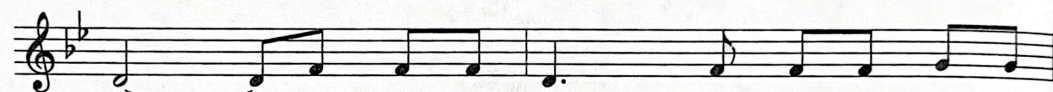
