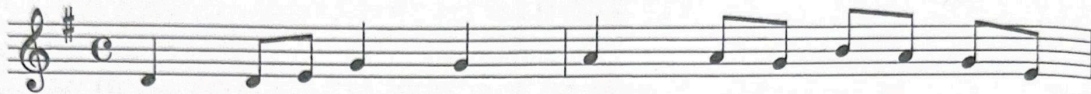


St. Michael the Archangel

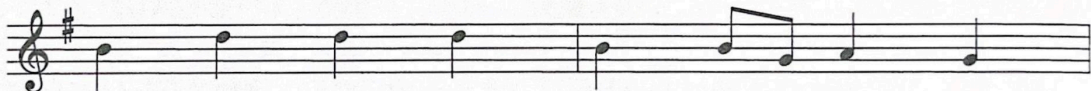

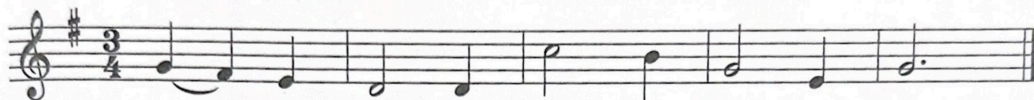
1 Kgs 19:4-8

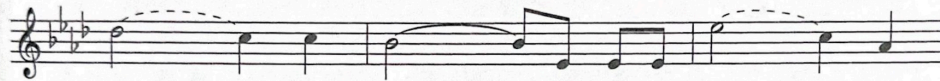

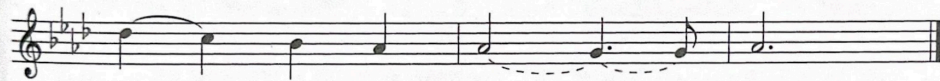

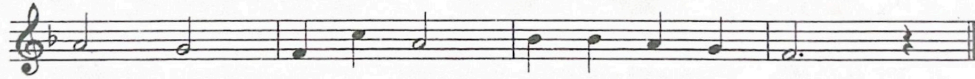
