Amen.

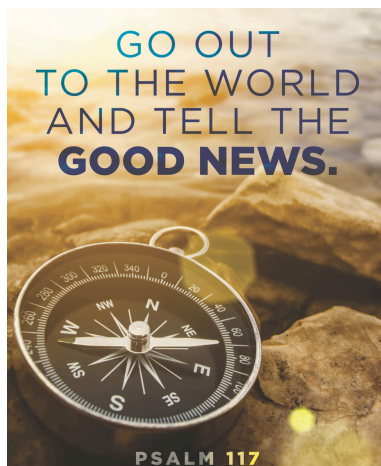

to the house of the LORD in clean vessels.

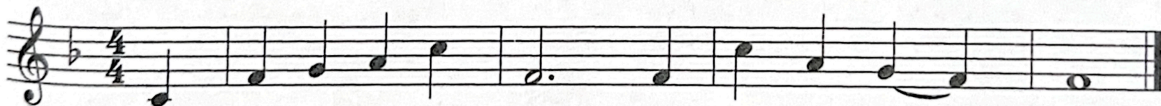
Some of these I will take as priests and Levites, says the LORD.

and some are first who will be last."

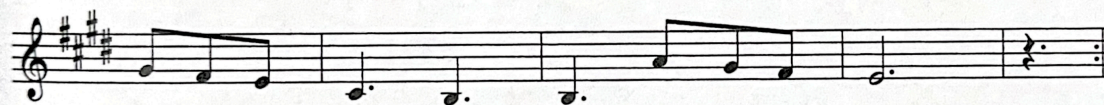
