from there He will come to judge the living and the dead.

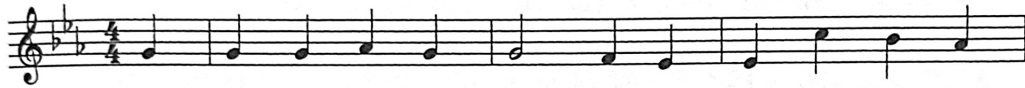

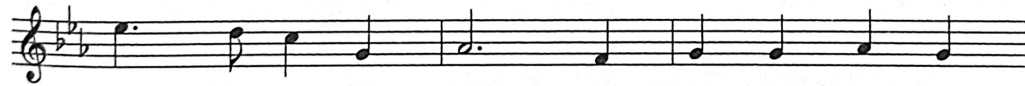

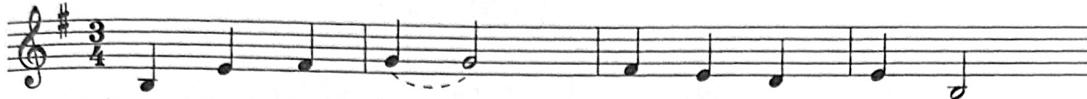
Mt 16:13-20
