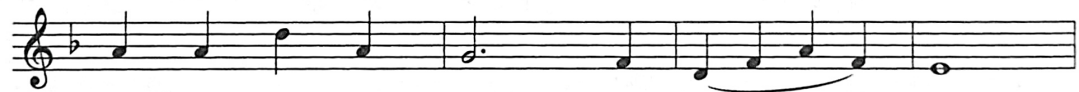

they saw no one else but Jesus alone.

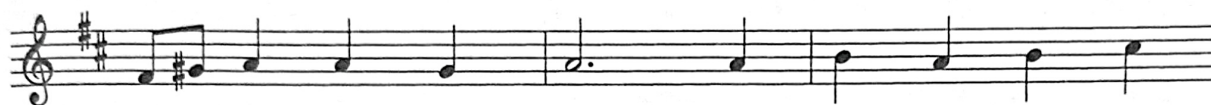
As they were coming down from the mountain,
